Introduction

This report is composed by statistical data for all activities conducted by NAEB and its stakeholders in July 2018. During this month total export revenues were \$ 42,310,112 compared to \$ 38,722,336 in 2017 the same period, representing 9.27% increment. This increment is a result of both good production and prices realized in Cereals, Pulses, vegetable oil, root and tubers and fish.tea also improved in term of sold quantities.

The standard quality recommended is 65 % for good quality tea. In order to preserve the quality of tea green leaf, special attention should be taken during tea plucking, weighting, loading, and offloading. The feeder roads should also be given special consideration.

Made tea production goes hand in hand with green leaf (GL) production. The increment attained 16% in comparison with July 2017. The increment came from good rain registered during the period and training provided to factory tea makers which contributed to the improvement in tea quality. Due to shortage of pluckers factories like Mushubi did not perform well.

I.3. Tea export sales

I.3.1. Export sales July 2018/Auction and Direct sales

Export sale was performed through auctioning of made tea at the Mombasa international market, and by the way of direct sales with private buyers. Auction sales revenue represented 79% of total values and direct sales revenue represented 21% of total values.

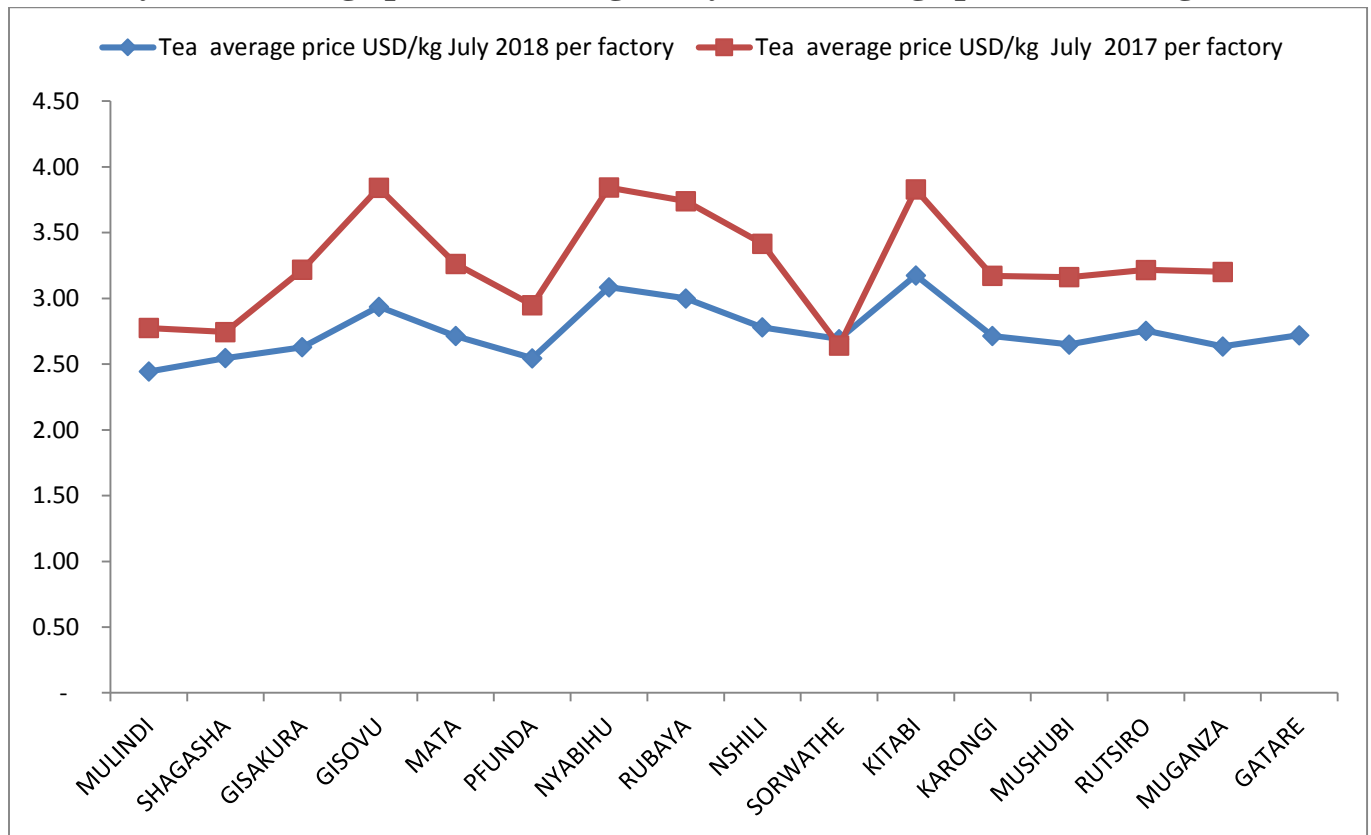

The increase is attributed to high volume of 2,927,263 kg made tea sold in July 2018 against 2,088,714 kg sold in July 2017. The average price of 2.74USD/kg was below compared to 3.27USD/kg of July 2017, over the same period. However, due to heavy rain in April and May, tea quality and average prices on international market were negatively affected. For better illustration see the following trend on tea average price.

For all factories the tea average price in July 2018 was below the average price in 2017 same period.

This is attributed to heavy rain in April and May that affected negatively the tea quality but also the offer on the market that affects average prices

Total coffee production July 2018 decreased by 543,176 kg equivalent to 26.02%. This is mainly attributed to heavy rain in April and May that affected negatively the coffee plantations. The decline of coffee international prices was also other reason that affected negatively production registered at NAEB coffee export warehouse as most of producers are still looking for buyers.

Total coffee revenues July 2018 compared to July 2017 decreased by 32.34%. This is attributed to small quantities of coffee sold in July 2018 in comparison with the quantity sold in July 2017 and to coffee average price in July 2018 (3.36 USD /kg against 3.89 USD/kg in July 2017). The same reason that buyers are few on the market, did not allow exporter to sell during this period.

The table shows that 78.65% of vegetables went to DRC including 66% export and 13% re export, dominated by tomatoes fresh and tomatoes paste: 20.95%, green vegetables: 14.34%; fresh beans 10.44% and eggplants 7.32%.

Uganda bought 12.49% of vegetables dominated by pepper: 5% and fresh Beans 4.32%. About 8.33% of vegetables went to Europe dominated by French beans: 7.21% and pepper 1%.

The rest of 96.86 % went to Regional market which 92.82% to DRC dominated by export and re-export of Juice 51%; sweet banana : 29%; re-export of wine made from grape: 4% , orange 4%. Uganda imported 3.89% dominated by Sweet banana 3% while 0.12% went to Burundi.
